FPWA is a non-profit organisation and is a member of Sexual Health and Family Planning Australia.

Services at FPWA

Clinical Services

Doctors and nurses are available by appointment at our Northbridge Clinic for confidential consultations on sexual and reproductive health issues for men, women and transgender people.

Clinicians can consult on testing and treatment for sexually transmissible infections, HIV and hepatitis screening, Pap smears, all aspects of contraception, pregnancy tests, planned and unplanned pregnancy information, sexual difficulties and dysfunction, PMS and period problems, menopause and fertility.

FPWA also has an important role in training doctors and nurses in sexual health.

Sexual Health Helpline

Nurses are available to answer questions and provide information and advice to members of the general public and professionals on matters relating to sexual and reproductive health.

Quarry Health Centre for Under 25s

Based in Fremantle, Quarry provides youth-friendly clinical, education and counselling services for young people aged 12-25 years. Non-judgemental, confidential and affordable sexual health and support services are offered in a safe environment.

Roe St Centre for Human Relationships

This service provides specialist counselling to individuals, families and couples and is gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender-friendly. Sessions are offered on unplanned pregnancy, infertility, sexuality, termination of pregnancy, sexual problems, relationships and more.

Male and female counsellors are available and telephone counselling can be arranged for those in rural or outer metropolitan areas.

The Roe St Centre also provides professional training and supervision.

Education and Training

FPWA is a major provider of community education and professional training in sexual and reproductive health in WA. The wide range of sexual health education sessions and programs for schools and community groups includes tailored sessions as well as our highly regarded Mooditj and PASH programmes for young people.

A major focus is building the capacity of the workforce and community to deliver sexual health services, particularly for Aboriginal communities and those in regional areas. Teachers, youth workers, Aboriginal Health Workers, health and other professionals are all catered for.

A range of professional training programs such as Mooditj Leader Training and accredited courses for nurses is complemented by follow up support, mentoring and consultancy services for teachers and others.

Library and Bookshop

The FPWA library and bookshop is open to the general public and has an extensive range of resources for loan, hire and sale.

The library collection focuses on sexual and reproductive health and related issues, with information suitable for individuals, students and professionals.

People 1st Programme (PIP)

PIP provides a range of human relationships, sexuality and protective education services for people with an intellectual disability, along with consultations for parents, carers and service providers.

One-to-one and school/group programmes are designed to respond to the individual needs of participants. Workshops are also available for service providers, parents/carers and staff working in education support centres, both in metropolitan and country areas.

Magenta and SWOPWA

Magenta provides health services, support, education and information to male, female and transgender workers in the sex industry.

Services are confidential and sex-worker friendly, and affordable safe sex supplies are available. Magenta also provides education for health professionals and community groups on issues affecting sex workers.

SWOPWA provides outreach services to street-based sex workers.
