## Library Services

- Loans** ..... max. of 4 books for 3 Weeks + 2 videos for 1 week
- Hiring** ..... videos (non-members), banana penises, contraceptive kits and other teaching resources
- Information** .....request information by phone, fax, mail, & email, or in person
- Photocopies** ..... 15c per A4 page, according to the Copyright Act
- Internet Access** ..... free Internet access, printing 15c per page

**Who may borrow?**

Everyone is welcome to use the library to browse, study and photocopy material. If you wish to borrow items it is necessary to join. Anyone can become a borrower by filling out a membership application and paying the annual FPWA Library Membership fee of \$10.00 (\$5.00 concession). Four books may be borrowed at one time for a **period of three weeks**, and items can be renewed by phone. People living in rural areas may borrow by mail.
